Any applicant should be self-motivated with a good work ethic. This job is 19.5 hours per week and is a community employment scheme position.

A store has perfectly good food that they cannot sell, in seconds, they upload a description of the food using their in-store scanner or our smartphone app. A local charity linked to the store through our platform receives a notification letting them know food is available for collection. The charity responds accepting the food and they go and collect it. It's a win-win! Charities have access to a supply of fresh food and businesses can contribute to their community in a meaningful way. Our partner charities, from breakfast clubs to homeless hostels to family support services, benefit through making savings on their food costs. This allows them to relocate their funding towards their core service and support their underlying mission.
